

REMINDER

GOLF CART RULES



As per SGI Regulations, to operate a golf cart in the Town of Strasbourg, you must:

- Only operate the cart during daylight hours (one half hour before sunrise and one half hour after sunset).
- Take the <u>most direct, shortest route</u> between the Golf Course and where the golf cart is stored. Golf carts are not allowed to be driven around Town. (This rule also applies to ATV's, dirt bikes, and snowmobiles - you need to take the most direct route out of Town and they are not to be driven around the community).
- Not operate the cart on a provincial highway or on a street with a posted speed of over 50 km/h.
- Display a slow moving warning sign on the back of the cart.
- Have a valid driver's license.
- Carry a minimum of \$200,000 in third party liability insurance.
- Drive in accordance with the rules of The Traffic Safety Act, including the provincial impaired driving laws.



- The Recreational Program

The Recreational Program relies solely on donations to provide programs, entertainment, and all the things that they do to keep the residents engaged and active.

STRASBOURG EMERGENCY MEASURES ORGANIZATION EMO Day - May 3, 2025

Strasbourg's Emergency Management Organization (EMO) hosted its first ever Emergency Preparedness Day on May 3rd at the Strasbourg Memorial Hall, to kick off the 2025 Canadian Emergency Preparedness Week (May 4 – 10). The day was sponsored by FireSmart Canada with a \$500 grant, to help inform our communities of the risks from wildland fires and ways to make communities safer and more resilient. The event featured multiple presentations, displays, prize draws and a fundraising BBQ lunch by the Strasbourg & District Fire & Rescue (SDFR) in support of their efforts to build a new fire hall that can fit the larger trucks required as SDFR replaces older (smaller) equipment.

Invitations were posted on every home in Strasbourg and all the Regional Emergency Management Committees from our municipal partners in the Living Sky Regional Emergency Management Organization were invited to attend. Over 100 residents of our Town and Region, and their children, came out to interact with the presenters and their displays, and play with special guest Sparky the Fire Dog.

Strasbourg Mayor Kelvin Schapansky kicked off the presentation portion of the event with greetings from the Town.

- Kelvin and SDFR Chief Greg Yung then accepted a \$500 donation from Razzle Dazzle Thrift Store representative Marilyn Labette towards a new LUNAR camera for SDFR firefighting and rescue operations.
- Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency (SPSA) personnel spoke on the FireSmart program and the
 opportunities available to make our homes and communities more resistant to wildfires. Their
 display booth distributed information specific to homeowners (also available at
 <u>www.firesmartcanada.ca</u>). SPSA also presented on their new Evacuation App, an online tool
 available to assist communities with alerting residents and managing tracking of evacuees, well as
 other resources available through SPSA in a declared emergency.
- Marj Mohr from Strasbourg EMS thanked the residents, businesses and municipalities of our region for the donations that allowed Strasbourg EMS to purchase a LUCAS machine. Marj and her crew explained and demonstrated the LUCAS machine, which can provide CPR and monitoring to a patient without tiring, allowing the ambulance crew to spend more time on patient care.
- Salvation Army representatives Major Ed Dean and Craig Broadhurst drove in and displayed two of the (many) service vehicles they have available to respond to a local emergency. Craig gave a presentation on the different equipment and trained personnel the Salvation Army can bring to assist, everything from Mobile Command Centres to Commercial Kitchens on wheels.
- SDFR Chief Greg Yung spoke to the capabilities of the SDFR, and SDFR members brought over their Fire Trucks and provided tours to attendees.
- Strasbourg EMO Coordinator Bernie Josephson thanked all our presenters and guests, and described some of the current ways the Town is prepared for emergencies, including our Water Plant emergency generator and the new emergency generator hookup at the Memorial Hall to provide power for a warming centre in case of a complete winter power failure.
